Gatton Country Fair

On Sunday 3rd July we have our annual Gatton Country Fair from 12-5pm. This is our biggest fundraiser of the year and is always a great day out for the whole family. We will have plenty of countryside, nature and wildlife stalls on the parterre as well as children's activities, food stalls and a Pimms bar. Out in the park we will have a Newfoundland dog rescue display, pony rides and punting along the Serpentine.

Harvest Mice

We started our harvest mouse (Micromys minutus) release project earlier in the year. Harvest mice are thought to be in decline and are listed as a BAP (Biodiversity Action Plan) Species which means they are under threat and require conservation action. Our breeding pairs have been busy and we are delighted that our first three releases of the young harvest mice went well.

A feeding platform has been constructed with a motion sensor camera. The mice are fed at irregular intervals to prevent them becoming dependent on the food but it allows us to monitor if the mice are still around. They have regularly been seen on the table and appear to be doing well. There are also signs they may be breeding.

Loveworks tour

We were pleased to welcome the Loveworks Cuppa Tea Club to Gatton Park on 26th May. The Cuppa Tea Club is a monthly social event for elderly residents in the local area and was set up to help overcome loneliness in later life.



After sandwiches, cake and of course a cup of tea the group had buggy tours around the park led by our two volunteer guides, David and Geoff. The group had lovely weather and thoroughly enjoyed the opportunity to get out and see the park and gardens. We are hoping to arrange another date in 2017.

Current Volunteering opportunities

The volunteers at Gatton make it what it is. If you would like to get involved there are many different ways you can help out.

Garden Restoration & Maintenance:

Since 1996, the garden restoration volunteers have brought back to life the rock and water garden, the Japanese garden and other areas of parkland. These areas need continuing development and maintenance. You don't have to be a gardener to help us but any experience would be useful.

Parkland Management Assistant:

Come and help the Park Warden with the maintenance and development of the park. Work involves hands on management of the woodland and grassland, habitat creation and surveying.

Estate Tour Guides:

Gatton Park has a rich heritage that we are keen to share with as many people as possible. This opportunity provides you with the chance to develop tours around the park and gardens by using the resources of our recently developed archive.
