

## Art in the Park

Some information and links to three artists who you may have studied at Gatton Park:

### **Andy Goldsworthy**

Show students examples of Andy Goldsworthy's sculptures, explain that these are often temporary as they are carried away by the tide or changed by the weather.

Take students outside and let them gather natural materials (or have materials prepared for them). Ask them to work in groups to make a sculpture from the materials.

Let students record their sculptures with a digital camera and then deconstruct it. The materials could be reused by another group.

Students can use the photos to make a display. Students should evaluate their own and each others work and possibly discuss the different ways groups have made use of the same materials.



## Henri Matisse



- Give students a sheet with pre prepared shape outlines on
- Have the students create a pattern on the reverse of the print out
- Let the students cut out the shapes and use them to create their own Matisse inspired piece of art on a contrasting coloured sheet of paper.
